Keith Cannon Dutson returned to his heavenly home Friday, December 3, 2021. His body is whole again and reunited with his parents, siblings and so many dear family members and friends.

Keith was born June 28, 1949 in Santa Monica, California to Keith Clinton and Lucy Cannon Dutson. After Keith's father passed away in an airplane accident, his family moved back to Salt Lake City. He grew up in the Avenues near grandparents and cousins. His extended family played an integral role in his childhood. He often reminisced about childhood memories with his cousins.

After graduating from West High School, he served a mission for the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints in Australia, Sydney Mission. Following his return, he served as a firefighter in the Air National Guard while attending the University of Utah. He married Phyllis in the Salt Lake Temple in 1973. They lived in Missouri, Montana, Washington and Utah.

Keith and Phyllis lived in the Seattle area for 24 years, raising their 4 children. He became an avid fan of the Seattle Mariners, especially enjoyed listening to Dave Niehaus call the games. One of Keith's favorite places was the doughnut shop and the end of the main plaza at Pike Place Market. If you ever visit the market, get a dozen donuts and eat them in memory of him.

He was a dedicated family man who loved his God, family, and country deeply. It was common to hear the Tabernacle Choir music ringing through the house, as Keith loved listening and attending choir performances. He and Phyllis consistently, faithfully and joyfully participated in their church choir both in Farmington and Seattle. Keith loved Christmas music. Christmas caroling with friends became a yearly tradition. He could also sing TV show theme songs and quote old TV commercials.

The smell of delicious hot breakfast in the morning or of homemade bread baking in the oven meant Keith had been in the kitchen making food for his family, or friends. Salmon on the grill, stir fry in the wok and popcorn were a few favorites. Not only did Keith cook delicious food for his family and friends, but he was handy with car repairs, home maintenance, and had a strong passion for airplanes. He could identify any kind of aircraft on the ground or in the air. Keith LOVED watching the Blue Angels each year at SeaFair in Seattle.

Keith served many outside his home, as well as his family. He had a solid testimony of our Savior Jesus Christ and His Gospel. He also served random strangers with his friendliness and ability to remember names. He knew the names of many employees at his favorite grocery stores, gas stations and the local Costco, especially at the sample stations—Shout out to Mike and Hilda!

Despite Keith's physical challenges in the later years in his life, he didn't let it interfere with his time as a husband, father and Papa. He and Phyllis attended grandchildren's sporting events, school plays, and piano recitals. The grandboys quickly changed baseball season to pizza season, because Nana and Papa always brought pizza after games for a treat.

Unfortunately, Keith's brief battle with Covid-19 left many hearts heavy. He did his best to fight, now his body lays peacefully to rest where he can be free from the physical burdens he lived with for many years.

He is survived by his wife, four children, their spouses, 6 grandchildren and many in-laws and cousins.
